MAIN STREET of Chatham offers browsing and shopping in fine specialty shops, along with art and craft galleries. Located less than one half mile from the inn.

THE CREATIVE ARTS CENTER features works by professionals, students, and various art groups from around the Cape. Located at 154 Crowell Road in Chatham. Take Rte 28 North to the lights by the Chatham Village Market. Turn right at the lights onto Crowell Road. The Creative Arts Center will be on the right side. PH: 508- 945-3583

CHATHAM ART GALLERY presents six Cape Cod Award Winning artists. From watercolors, oils, pastels and engravings. Located at 464 Main Street in Chatham. PH: 508-945-4699.

Did you know that there are over 2,000 historical artifacts on display in the **OLD ATWOOD HOUSE MUSEUM** in Chatham. Take a look into Chatham's history and visit the museum at 347 Stage Harbor Road. Open Tuesday through Friday, 1-4pm.

Stop by Chatham's **RAILROAD MUSEUM** on Depot Road. Turn right onto Highland Avenue off of Seaview Street. At the end of Highland, turn left and make an immediate right onto Depot Road. Across from the museum is a wonderful wood constructed playground, open to the public.

Take a trip to the **NATIONAL SEASHORE** on your way to Provincetown. Stop at one of the three visitors centers on your way. Salt Pond Visitor Center, Eastham, Rte 6, PH: 508- 255-3421; Park Headquarters, Marconi Area, Wellfleet. PH: 508-349-3785; Province Lands Visitors Center, Provincetown. (Race Point Road) PH: 508-487-1256.

Visit the **WELLFLEET BAY WILDLIFE SANCTUARY** to get in touch with nature. Fun for both adults and children. They have a visitor's center/museum and nature trails at the Sanctuary in Wellfleet. They also offer Marsh Tours, trips to North Beach and to Monomoy Island. Ask the concierge for times and to register for the trips. Wellfleet PH: 508-349-2615.

ANTIQUE SHOPS abound on Historic Old King's Highway (Route 6A) from Brewster to Sandwich.

Visit the **POTTERS OF CAPE COD**. Located throughout the Cape, some in Chatham with the majority along Route 6A from Brewster to Yarmouth.



CAPE COD MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY. A living museum using the resources of Cape Cod and the surrounding Stony Brook Valley for the discovery, study and protection of our natural world. The public is invited to walk the trails unaccompanied. Located on Route 6A in Brewster. PH: 508-896-3867

CAPE COD MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS invites you to view the new works of art in the Museum's growing collection. The exhibits are all by Cape Cod or Cape-related artists. Located on Route 6A in Dennis on the grounds of the Cape Playhouse. PH: 508-385-4477.

HERITAGE PLANTATION of Sandwich. Offers a military museum, antique car museum, miles of plants and gardens, and a 1912 carousel. Located off exit 2 in Sandwich. PH: 508-888-1222.

View some of the finest glass work produced in the 19th century at the **SANDWICH GLASS MUSEUM**. The Museum's gift shop offers reproductions, books, and items related to the Museum's collections. Located at the corner of Route 130 and Tupper Road in Sandwich. PH: 508-888-0251.

Go shopping indoors at the **CAPE COD MALL** in Hyannis. The mall houses new stores including Macy's, Abercrombie & Fitch, Ann Taylor. PH: 508-771-0200.
